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Subject: Proposal for a REGULATION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND
OF THE COUNCIL on the statute and funding of European political parties
and European political foundations (recast)
- Exchange of views

I. BACKGROUND

1. On 22 March 2022, the Council (General Affairs) gave the Presidency a mandate¹ (adopting a partial general approach) on the above proposal to enter into negotiations with the European Parliament.
2. The Parliament adopted its mandate at the Plenary session of 15 September 2022².

3. On that basis, three trilogue meetings were held on 29 September, 25 October and 24 November 2022. The Committee of Permanent Representatives was informed about the outcome of these trilogue meetings on 5 October, 4 November and 30 November 2022 respectively.
4. With a view to allowing for a detailed examination of the proposal and facilitating discussions at the trilogue meetings, seven interinstitutional technical meetings have been held to date (10, 13 and 21 October 2022 and 9, 10, 11 and 17 November 2022). The Presidency regularly briefed the Working Party on General Affairs (GAG) on progress made at technical meetings and on possible compromise proposals.
5. Following the third trilogue, negotiations were suspended due to the stalemate on the two key political issues of ‘the financing of national referenda’ and the ‘involvement of non-EU parties in EUPPFs’, despite the Czech Presidency's proposal to hold an eighth technical meeting on 8 December 2022, which was declined by the European Parliament.
6. With a view to a relaunch of the negotiations, the Working Party on General Affairs (GAG) met on 7 and 23 February 2023 to discuss possible ways forward and compromise options on the main outstanding issues.

II. STATE OF PLAY OF THE NEGOTIATIONS

7. Following the technical meetings held so far, all substantive provisions, political and technical, of the draft Regulation have been addressed, with the exception of the articles on the transparency of political advertising. The Presidency’s intention is to propose that Articles 5 and 13 and additional references in several other articles and recitals be removed from the text in order to decouple EUPPF from the ongoing negotiations on the Regulation on transparency of political advertising.

The main outstanding issues

8. The positions on the two major outstanding issues – namely, the involvement of non-EU parties in EUPPFs and the financing of national referenda campaigns - remained unbridgeable so far and possible new compromise options should be explored with the Parliament, while preserving the main principles in the Council’s approach.

9. Involvement of non-EU parties in EUPPFs

The involvement of non-EU parties in EUPPFs is one of the key political issues of this negotiation, with both sides holding very strong views. Three questions are at stake: (i) membership, (ii) association fees from outside the Union, and (iii) compliance with EU values and the need to counter the risk of foreign interference. On all three questions, the Presidency has made it clear at the technical meetings with the other institutions that a compromise between the co-legislators must address in a robust manner the risk of foreign interference, both in terms of participation of non-EU parties in EUPPFs and of financing. Discussions were therefore centred on finding the right balance between the Council's concerns and the EP stance that EUPPFs should remain free to decide on their possibilities of affiliations and that EUPPFs are a strong instrument for engaging with neighbouring and candidate countries. In particular, negotiations have focused on the way to define stricter safeguards on the three aforementioned questions.

10. Financing of national referenda

The financing of national referenda campaigns is the other key political issue where the co-legislators have very different positions. At the technical meetings held so far, the Presidency, on the grounds of sovereignty of Member States, has reiterated the Council's position of limiting co-financing to 'joint events' organized by EUPPFs together with their members. To facilitate a compromise, the Commission has tabled some suggestions to define more precisely the scope of referenda for which EUPPFs financing could be allowed, as well as to reduce the risk of interference. The European Parliament has signalled some openness to take on board some of the Commission's suggestions.

Other outstanding issues

11. Gender requirements

The European Parliament has introduced in its resolution a new article foreseeing: (i) gender balance in the governing bodies of EUPPFs, (ii) a gender equality plan and (iii) a protocol to prevent sexual harassment.

The Commission is politically close to the Parliament's position but has also offered to suggest alternative language to limit the scope of the Parliament text on this issue.

12. Financial issues

a) Co-financing rate

The Council foresees 10% co-financing rate for EUPPs and 5% for EUPFs. The Parliament and the Commission introduce a 0% co-financing rate in the election year and 5% every other year.

b) New accounting category of 'own resources' for funding EUPPFs

Two issues are at stake: the definition and the threshold for this new accounting category for money generated by the activities of EUPPFs (such as sales of books and workshop fees).

On the definition, compromise language was agreed during discussions at technical level, leading to the new labelling of 'self-generated resources'. The remaining issue in the definition is the reference to 'non-profit activities' for the Parliament. The Parliament agreed to accept the compromise definition on the condition that this definition would also be reflected in the recital.

On the threshold, the Council and the Commission refer to the annual budget, considering this reference as more transparent and more predictable, while the European Parliament refers to contributions and association fees: the Council proposes 2%, the Commission 5% of the annual budget and Parliament proposes 10% of contributions and associations fees. A compromise is under discussion based on the threshold of 3% and a reference to the annual budget.

13. Due diligence mechanism

Both co-legislators agree that the revised Regulation should increase transparency of all financial activities. In principle, they support the introduction of a due diligence mechanism while having different preferences as for the threshold (Parliament and the Commission at 3000 EUR, Council at 1500 EUR). Besides, the Parliament also aims to increase the transparency of contributions from individual members where these are higher than 1500 EUR. While the specific amount is still to be agreed on, the more general question is to find the right balance between transparency and administrative burden. The Presidency has reiterated the Council position that the lower thresholds are relevant and necessary to increase the transparency of both donations and contributions.

III. PRESIDENCY SUGGESTIONS FOR A POSSIBLE COMPROMISE

14. With the aim to relaunch the negotiations with the European Parliament, and taking into consideration the views expressed by delegations at the GAG meetings on 7 and 23 February 2023, the Presidency is now presenting, in the Annex to this note, a set of text proposals which aim at introducing some flexibility to the mandate given by the Council on 22 March 2022, in view of a possible compromise with the Parliament.
15. Compared to the initial approach in the Council mandate, the following are the key compromise proposals and options. Some of these proposals reflect the text previously proposed by the Czech Presidency; others are new Presidency proposals. The latter are highlighted in yellow in the Annex to this note.
 - a) Membership of non-EU parties in EUPPFs

It is highly desirable to establish clear and predictable rules for the involvement of non-EU parties in EUPPFs. Given the importance of this issue for an overall compromise, the Presidency believes that regulating the issue of membership is crucial to counter foreign interference and that a final compromise must include strong and appropriate safeguards. In relation to the compromise proposals presented last November, the new Presidency proposal includes further limitations to the participation of non-EU parties and foundations in EUPPFs, as follows:

- by narrowing the geographic scope: introducing a new geographical limitation for non-EU parties, by only allowing member parties in EUPPFs having their seat in an EFTA country, in a former EU member state, in a candidate country, or in a country entitled to use the euro as official currency (see in Annex Art.2 (1) (3) - row 100 bis);
- by creating a new category by which non-EU parties would become ‘associated members’ for the sake of increased clarity and transparency (see in the Annex Art. 4 (1)(j) - row 174);
- by restricting participation of non-EU parties in EUPPFs' decision-making: introducing a safeguard in the statutes of European political parties in order to ensure that ‘associated members’ and their representatives:

- i) cannot, individually or collectively, impose a course of action against, or block, a majority of the voting EU citizens or members;
- ii) cannot participate in decisions regarding the constitutional order and structure of the European Union, such as the revision of the Treaties of the European Union and the European electoral system, nor on decisions of strategic importance for the EU;
- iii) cannot receive executive powers by delegation in the governing bodies (see in the Annex Art. 4 (1)(j) - row 174).

In addition to the items mentioned above, the Presidency proposes to maintain the safeguard which was proposed last semester, i.e. to exclude political parties, as well as in the case of associated member parties their individual representatives, targeted by sanctions under Union restrictive measures adopted pursuant to Article 215 TFEU (see in the Annex Art. 3 (1) (ee) - row 140 and Art. 23 (10) (1) - row 415).

In addition, regular monitoring of the respect of EU values (Art. 2 TEU) is introduced, which will be ensured by the Authority for Political Parties and Foundations (see in the Annex Art.3 (1) (e) - row 140 and Art. 3 (2) (d) - row 149).

b) Membership fees from parties outside the EU

In order to mitigate the risk of foreign interference, the Presidency proposes to maintain the Council's mandate, not to allow any funding from non-EU parties to EUPPFs.

c) Gender requirements

The Presidency suggests keeping the proposal already made last November to limit the scope of the requirements proposed by Parliament in the new Art. 6 (a). In substance, the Presidency's suggested compromise supports the first requirement of 'gender balance in the governing bodies of EUPPFs' proposed by Parliament, while limiting the binding nature of sub-paragraphs 2 and 3 (respectively 'adopting a gender equality plan' and 'having 'a protocol to prevent sexual harassment'), by moving these two requirements into recitals, or by finding alternative wording (see in Annex, Art. 6 (a) - row 206).

d) Financing of national referenda

The Presidency proposes to maintain the Council's mandate (see Art. 24 (2) - row 432).

e) Co-financing

The Presidency proposes to maintain the approach to use co-financing as a general adjustment variable in the context of the overall negotiations, namely increasing the co-financing rate from 90%, as foreseen in the Council's mandate, to 95% for each and every year, including the election year. Such an increase would be granted on the condition that the Parliament accepts significant limitations in the role of non-EU parties to reduce the risk of foreign interference (see in the Annex Art. 20 (3) - row 358).

f) Due diligence mechanism and transparency requirements

During the negotiations, both co-legislators have agreed that the revised Regulation should increase transparency for all financial activities and contribute to mitigate the risk of foreign interference (rows 47 and 177 in the Annex). On this issue, the Presidency intends to maintain the position set out in the partial general approach, i.e. to lower the threshold for triggering the due diligence mechanism at EUR 1500 both for donations and contributions. As the Parliament's proposal on individual contributions goes in the same direction of enhanced transparency, the Presidency suggests accepting the Parliament's proposal in this regard (see in the Annex Art.23 (5) - row 394).

IV. CONCLUSIONS

16. The Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to examine the Presidency compromise proposals and text suggestions as set out in the Annex to this note (in the fourth column of the table), with a view to resuming discussions with the European Parliament.
17. The Presidency will report to the Committee on the next developments.
