Subject: Adoption of the proposal for a Parenthood Regulation

Proposal for a Council Regulation on jurisdiction, applicable law, recognition of decisions and acceptance of authentic instruments in matters of parenthood and on the creation of a European Certificate of Parenthood (2022/0402(CNS)) was published by the Commission on 7 December 2022 and based on Article 81(3) TFEU calling for the use of the special legislative procedure, where after consulting the Parliament, the Council adopts the final text by unanimity. The Parliament's opinion on the proposal, prepared by the JURI Committee, was adopted by the plenary on 14 December 2023 and transferred to the Council. In its opinion, the Parliament focused on safeguarding children's rights derived from the parenthood regardless the legal relationship between the parents or the way the child was conceived. The Parliament expressed support for the main objective of the proposed Regulation, which is to address the issue of non-recognition of parenthood status by assuring that if a child-parent relation has been established in one Member State all other Member States shall recognise it without additional proceedings in place.

Taking into account that the Council has been working on the proposal for more than two years:

1. How the Commission facilitates the discussion on the proposal in the Council?
2. Is the Commission prepared/ready/planning, in case of the inability to find unanimity among the Member States, to pursue the objectives of the proposed Regulation with different legislative instruments and/or under different mechanisms that are foreseen by the Treaties?
