NOTE FOR THE ATTENTION OF DIRECTORS-GENERAL AND HEADS OF SERVICE

Subject: Adoption of the post-2027 multiannual financial framework package and accompanying sectoral proposals

We are now entering the final phase of work on the preparation of the Commission's proposals for the post-2027 multiannual financial framework. Your services have been actively involved in the preparation of the impact assessments and in the drafting of the legislative proposals. We are grateful for your constructive contributions.

As indicated in the forward planning of College agendas ⁽¹⁾, the sectoral programmes will be adopted in two blocks, to ensure a smooth and collegial decision-making process and to provide sufficient visibility to each programme.

The current planning is as follows. Programme titles are indicative and subject to change.

Proposals for adoption on 16 July:

- Political communication and legal proposals for the post-2027 multiannual financial framework, including related own resources sectoral proposals
- National and regional partnership plans, including legal acts for HOME funds.
- European Competitiveness Fund, including the research framework programme's (FP10) legislation.
- Global Europe Instrument
- European Peace Facility
- Connecting Europe Facility
- Union Civil Protection Mechanism
- Erasmus – European Solidarity Corps
- Creative Europe – Citizens, equality, rights and values
- Performance framework

Proposals for adoption on 17 September:

- Justice programme;

- Single Market Programme +
- Euratom Research and Training - ITER
- Instrument for Nuclear Safety cooperation and decommissioning
- Nuclear decommissioning (LT)
- Overseas Countries and Territories (incl. Greenland)

Those services tasked with preparing legal proposals ⁽²⁾ should work in close coordination with other concerned services. Our teams in the Secretariat-General and DG Budget are available to support you in this process. To ensure a high level of coherence and consistency across the package, you are asked **to send full drafts of all acts to be adopted in July to the Secretariat-General, DG Budget and the Legal Service by noon on 25 June at the latest, for a pre-consultation.**

Interservice consultations for all the sectoral acts to be adopted on 16 July should be launched by the lead service – in close cooperation with potential co-responsible services – by 30 June and close at the latest on 4 July. Their duration should be at least five working days. These fast-track consultations in writing should be treated as ‘politically sensitive and/or important (PSI)’ initiatives, with sensitive treatment (‘need to know’ lists), conducted in line with the applicable rules. Your services do not need to submit a Decide Planning entry for these proposals.

In view of the time constraints and large volume of proposals, a **language derogation** has been granted for the proposals to be adopted in English only, with translated versions to be provided as soon as possible after adoption. Your respective Cabinets do not need to request this derogation from the Cabinet of the President.

Interservice consultations for proposals scheduled for adoption in September should be launched ideally in July and concluded at the latest on 5 September, subject to the same conditions as described above.

We count on your continuous support in the coming weeks to deliver the best possible proposals for a streamlined, flexible and impactful budget that matches our Union’s ambitions.
