Underlines the growing security challenges facing the EU, including those identified in the Niinistö report; insist on the need to strengthen cross-border police, judicial and inter-agency cooperation to respond effectively to transnational crime and hybrid threats, and stresses that any reinforcement of law-enforcement cooperation must be matched by adequate budgetary support for judicial cooperation.
